The New Victory Theater is located on 42nd Street between 7th Avenue and 8th Avenue.

There are a lot of people walking around, lots of big signs and lights, and lots of noises from the cars, taxis and people.


There are different ways to get to the theater.




We might take the subway to the Times Square-42nd Street station. Lots of trains stop at this station, so it may be crowded.

When we exit the subway station, we will probably be able to see the theater because it is so close!

If we take a bus, the MTA bus stops and The Port Authority are also close to the theater.



If we drive to the theater, there are indoor and outdoor garages on 42nd Street where we can park our car and then walk over to the theater.



If we take a taxi, we will give our driver the address for the New Victory Theater and they will drop us off right in front.




We may need to wait in line at the ticket office to pick up our tickets.



While we are waiting, I will stay with my family and try to wait calmly.

We will then give our tickets or mobile phone to one of the ticket-takers. They will scan our tickets and tell us where to go next.



We will go into the main lobby area where we will see many other families who are also coming to see the show!

We will either be sitting in the orchestra or mezzanine level.



These are the entrances to each level.

Our tickets will tell us exactly where to sit. We do not get to choose our seats.

When it is time for the show to start, the theater will get darker and everyone will get quiet.




During the show I will try to remember to sit quietly and calmly so that everyone can enjoy the show!

I will try to remember that even if parts of the show get a little loud, or the makeup and costumes look strange or scary, none of this can hurt me or anyone else at the show.



Some parts of the show might be very funny and silly, and they will probably make me laugh.



Some parts of the show might make me nervous, but all of the actors and performers are EXPERTS, and have practiced a lot so that they will not get hurt.

If I get nervous or feel scared, I can:

Cover or close my eyes.



Hold my grown-up's hand.




Cover my ears with my hands or put on headphones.



Use a fidget tool.



If I need a break during the show, I can ask the grown-ups that I am with if they can take me.




There are open spaces in the hallways or in the lobby area where we can go for a walk or sit in a quiet corner.

We can also ask any of the theater staff if we need help finding something - like the gift shop or bathroom.



In the middle of the show, there may be a break called an INTERMISSION.



During the break, many people will go into the lobby areas. If I want to, I can ask for a snack or a drink. I can also ask to use the bathroom.

After the break, everyone will come back and sit down in their seats again. The theater will get darker and quieter again, just like at the beginning of the show.



The actors will come back out and give even more great performances!

At the end of the show, all of the actors will come out on stage. This is called a CURTAIN CALL.



Many people will clap and cheer so the performers know how much they liked the show! When people really like a show, sometimes they stand up and cheer during the curtain call.

After the show is finished I will leave the theater with my family.



Sometimes we may have to wait a little while before we can leave the theater, because it can get very crowded when everyone is leaving at the same time.

**Hold one of my
grown-ups' hands**



**Talk to my family
or friends**



Use a fidget tool
