
## **Lighting and sound adjustments**

A quiet place to relax with fidget tools and bean bag chairs.

A place where you can take a break with fidget tools and a live video feed of ***Chicka Chicka Boom Boom: The Musical***.

## Additional Staff



NEW VICTORY staff members will circulate throughout the theater during the performance. They will have fidgets and earplugs available and can help with other support needs.

**TITLE:** *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom: The Musical*

**RUN TIME:** 60 minutes, including a 10-minute Talk-Back.

If you need to take a break during the show, you can leave the theater and return. There may be some times when you have to wait a few minutes to re-enter because it is safer for the performers. The ushers will let you know when you can re-enter.

Following the performance there will be a Talk-Back. During a Talk-Back, a few actors from *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom: The Musical* will answer two to four questions from the audience. You can raise your hand if you would like to ask a question.

Only a few audience members will have a turn to ask a question. Not everyone with their hand raised will be called on. If you do not get to ask your question, you can ask one of the NEW VICTORY Teaching Artists and they may know the answer.

**ART FORMS:** Musical Theater and Puppetry

**ONE-SENTENCE SUMMARY:** Sing and dance along as puppeteered letters from the alphabet ambitiously climb a coconut tree before tumbling down in a burst of laughter and color.

**ACCESS NOTE:** Please note that the performance includes moments of audience participation. You will be invited to respond to questions from the actors, like “If a car goes really fast, it goes...” OR “If I had black and white stripes and looked like a horse, I would be a...”. You will also be invited to clap along as well as participate in moments of call-and-response. You are welcome to engage at whatever level feels comfortable.

**Did you know** *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom*, the book, has two sequels?

*Chicka Chicka 1, 2, 3* and *Boom Chicka Rock*



*Chicka Chicka Boom Boom: The Musical* follows the lowercase alphabet letters as they race one another to climb a tall coconut tree.



The five actors puppeteer the letters, sing and dance, and interact with the audience through call-and-response and fill-in-the-blank storytelling.

First you will meet Little A, Little B, and Little C as they begin the race to the top of the coconut tree.



Then will meet Little H, Little I, Little J and Little K as they join the race to the top of the coconut tree.



After that you will meet Little L, Little M, Little N, Little O and Little P as they join the race to the top of the coconut tree.



Then you will meet Little Q, Little R, Little S, Little T, Little U and Little V as they join the race to the top of the coconut tree.



Next you will meet Little W, Little X and Little Y as they join the race to the top of the coconut tree.



Finally, it's time for Little Z to join the race.  
Little Z has been struggling to find their place and is always being left behind. As they add themselves to the coconut tree, all the lowercase letters come tumbling down.



The parents of the lowercase letters, the uppercase letters, rush to their children at the coconut tree, bandage them up and take them home.



In the finale, the actors recap the story, and the little letters get ready to climb again, keeping the playful rhythm of the original book.



There are moments in *Chicka Chicka Boom Boom: The Musical* that may make you feel overwhelmed, excited or even emotional. You can:

Close or cover your eyes



Talk to a grown-up or friend



Close or cover your ears



Use a fidget tool



Take a few breaths



Take a break in the lower lobby

Laugh



Clap



Vocalize or chat with a neighbor
